

A woman was diagnosed with advanced cancer and given only a few months to live by doctors. She called her Pastor. They talked for a while, discussing her funeral, the songs/bible readings she wanted, how she wanted her **FAVORITE BIBLE** in one hand, and a **FORK** in the other. When he asked about the fork, she said...

WHEN THE MAIN COURSE IS OVER, I LOVE IT WHEN SOMEONE SAYS, "KEEP YOUR FORK; SOMETHING WONDERFUL IS COMING" IT DIDN'T MATTER WHAT THE SURPRISE WAS, I LOVED IMAGINING WHAT IT MIGHT BE. WHEN THEY SEE A FORK IN MY CASKET, I WANT THEM TO WONDER, "WHAT'S WITH THE FORK". PLEASE TELL THEM, "SOMETHING BETTER IS COMING, SO YOU KEEP YOUR FORK, TOO"

People were puzzled by the fork as they filed by her casket prior to the funeral but the Pastor stood there with tears in his eyes. Life, as we know it, is an APPETIZING MEAL, but no matter how good we feel when the meal is over, it is wise to KEEP YOUR FORK. Something WONDERFUL is coming. If Easter does not send chills up and down our spines every time you ponder it, then we may have one foot in the grave already. We don't have to wait until the grave to TASTE IT. In fact, something wonderful has already come. Celebrate the news: THE SON IS OUT. Rain or not rain, sorrow or no sorrow, the SON IS OUT. God raised Jesus from the grave to bring new life to his people, before and after death.
