Great Ends of Church

My grandfather and I saw the world differently. This crazy old man from another world taught me that honesty is better than shading the truth. That all work has dignity, and that Jesus was right when he said being a servant is more important than being a boss. Had I written him off as a guy from another time, it would've been foolish. We do well to listen to the wisdom of all who have gone before us. Our Grandparents in the faith have wisdom to share. Our denomination, **PCUSA**, has given us **language** to describe **the church's purpose**. What does **church mean to you?** What do we **mean to the world?** In our Book of Order, there are **6 statements**, called the "**great ends or great purposes**" of the church.

Church exists for the Proclamation of Gospel for the salvation of humanity.

Our first purpose is to remind people that they belong to God before they belong to anything or anyone else. The 2nd great purpose:

Church exists for the shelter, Nurture, and spiritual fellowship of God's children

Church exists to foster spiritual friendship. Church is a community, not a building. We belong to one another. The third great end:

Church exists for the Maintenance of Divine Worship.

The language "maintenance of divine worship" may sound odd, but it carries a reminder: what we want to happen in worship is crucial, but it isn't the only thing that matters. What does God want to happen? The 4th great end:

Church exists for the Preservation of the Truth.

God is the source of truth. In God's world, we don't determine truth or create truth; we simply discover the truth. Truth is the ligament that holds communities together-from families to nations. Apart from truth-telling, trust erodes, and communities fall apart. The 5th great end of Church:

Church exists for the Promotion of Social Righteousness
Righteousness is relational. Jesus shows up not just in our hearts, but our relationships. To be righteous is to be in right relationship with God and right

relationship with one another. The last great end:

Church exists to be an exhibition of heaven to the world.

This great end reminds us that it isn't enough to make Christians of others; it is more important that we be Christian to others. That is the theological foundation we have for all mission.

On World Communion Sunday, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. Having been in Tennessee for about four months now they are getting more settled, but they have a long way to go to be totally comfortable with life here that is so different from their life in Ukraine before the Russian invasion began. May the Holy Spirit continue to walk along with them on their journey!

No Faith Builds in Kingsport This Year

Laura Kelly, Executive Director of Holston Habitat for Humanity talked with Bob Stoots about having no Faith Builds in Kingsport this year. She explained that to reduce the backlog of applicants in the que and to improve turnaround time from approval to occupancy, the process was changed to receive applications only during designated times. This allows Habitat to evaluate a manageable number of applicants in a more efficient way to select qualified future owners in areas where land is already available and ready for a home. Inflation has had a significant impact on the cost of Habitat houses which makes the financial criteria harder for applicants to meet. Also more single mothers are applying for Habitat houses, but that demographic has trouble performing the required "sweat equity" for time based reasons. She regrets that no faith builds are ready for Kingsport this Fall because of no approved applicants. However, she anticipates one or maybe two for Kingsport in the Spring. She asks for our continued support, and as an alternative this Fall, she says "Holston Habitat for Humanity encourages their volunteers and the entire Tri-Cities community to be a part of the Kingsport Homeless Ministry project to build a new shelter and day center for homeless in the Kingsport community." First Presbyterian Church has provided significant financial support to the Grace House project and has already worked one day there on several things; removing ceiling tiles & insulation, deconstructing a bathroom to be repurposed for handicapped access, removing carpet, and moving walls to make a new bedroom. Future work days will be planned and scheduled to mesh with the other ongoing construction activities needed to achieve a tentative January 2023 opening date. Outreach Service Project at Second Harvest Food Bank

On September 21, we had 17 First Presbyterian Church members and one special guest, Dr Bob Miller, volunteer to package food for distribution to Food for Kids Backpack participants and for Seniors and Walk-in clients. In the morning session our group of 13 filled 381 bags of food weighing on average 12.5 lbs each. The afternoon group of 7 filled 468 Food for Kids bags. The Food for Kids bags are smaller and contain items more suitable for young people to prepare for themselves to supplement their weekend nourishment. Kids Bags are about half the size of those for walk-in clients. We had a very productive day and enjoyed lots of fun, fellowship and service. Thanks to all who participated.







Volunteer Drivers Are In High Demand! Will you help us?

Meals on Wheels of Kingsport is a community based service that prepares and delivers over 200 fresh, nutritious meals each weekday to elderly and disabled individuals in the greater Kingsport area. However, we are "more than just a meal." Our drivers provide social contact and friendly checks on our meal recipients. These special connections help us monitor our clients' well-being and brighten their day. United Way of Greater Kingsport provides 85 percent of the program costs for Meals on Wheels of Kingsport today. The remainder of our funds are provided by individual and organization donations including First Presbyterian Church. Meals are prepared by a team of volunteer cooks, Monday through Friday at First Presbyterian Church and Waverly Road Presbyterian Church. The meals are delivered by teams of volunteer drivers throughout the Greater Kingsport Area. Volunteer drivers are still needed to meet the needs of our growing base of meal recipients. Drivers typically deliver once or twice a month. This is done on Mondays through Fridays from 10:30 until 12. Would you like to spend a couple of hours, once a month, delivering much need meals to folks in need and get a big warm smile in return? If so, give us a call at 423-247-4511. We will get you on the schedule at a time that matches your availability.
