An important 20th century theologian and martyr who was involved in the plot to assassinate Adolf Hitler was hanged before the end of World War II. Bonhoeffer wrote extensively on what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ...a disciple. Simple Obedience

A young boy in a children's hospital was giving the nurses a fit. One day a visitor noticed it and made the boy a deal: if he could be good for an entire week, she would give him a dime when she returned. A week later, there she was, "I won't ask the nurses how you did. You must tell me. Do you deserve a dime" He grinned, "Just give me a penny"

How much would we get for our faithfulness to God? I can only speak for myself: being obedient to Christ is harder than I thought. He isn't interested in one week but a lifetime of service. We would obey God, but we'd like to do it on our terms. We talk about loving God, but we spend too much time ignoring him. We are a **BUNDLE OF GOOD INTENTIONS**. We want to serve God, but we let other things get in our way. We could let that fact drive us crazy, or we could face the truth God wants us to see...

JESUS EXPECTS MORE FAILURE IN US THAN WE EXPECT OF OURSELVES HE ACCEPTS OUR FAILINGS MORE FREELY THAN WE DO.

If we don't find being obedient to God difficult, it may be a sign that we haven't tried hard to be obedient. I am not the person I would like to be. I fall short of loving/serving Jesus every day. But you've never a met a person who wanted to please God more than I do. I just keep getting in God's way and I have grown so numb to my own excuses that I no longer see them as excuses.

If Jesus had just made being a Christian more convenient, then maybe we wouldn't keep missing the mark. Are you thankful for your sin? I am! If it weren't for my sin, I would never have known God, never have found joy of knowing that I am accepted and acceptable. I am thankful for my sin, but I also hate it. I hate what it does to me and how it leads me from my ideals. God keeps accepting us back. He loves us **as we are**, but he won't let us **stay as we are**. Only those who know how much God love us can ever face their sin. They receive the one gift God wants us to have: **HONESTY**. Honesty about who we are makes us better than we are. The bad news: there is no way to hide from God. The good news: there is no need to hide from him.
