



The worship committee invites you to participate in Epiphany Star Words, a devotional exercise for the coming year. Stars will be available until the beginning of Lent on February 22. Look for them on the piano (chapel) or harpsichord (sanctuary) or ask Alice for one. On the reverse of each star is a word. Please select stars without turning them over, so that the word is “given” to you rather than chosen by you. When you get home, place the star somewhere you will see it often, perhaps on the refrigerator, on a mirror, in an often-used drawer, or similar place.

- During the coming year, prayerfully look and listen for God’s guidance related to your word:
- Ask yourself if this word makes you feel comforted or challenged.
- Look up the dictionary definition of your word.
- Use an internet search to look for your word in scripture. (Versions vary, so you might also search for synonyms of your word.)
- Pray and meditate on your word. Allow God to open doors and spark ideas in your heart and mind.

If you are so inclined, journal, write poetry, or make art in response to God’s working in your life as related to your word. We welcome you to share these tangible responses in our church newsletter anytime over the next 12 months.

Can God really move in your life through a word on a paper star? God moves in mysterious ways. May we be open to the leading of the Spirit in this simple prayer practice as we continue our journey of faith in the new year.
