Friends in Faith Class Begins New Series begins Today!

"Into All the World: Participating in God's Mission"

The Friends in Faith Sunday School Class will begin a new 6-week series on August 20 entitled "Into All the World: Participating in God's Mission." When we think about "missional vocation" is when we begin to see ourselves differently.
