Even Though

The day my ministry changed wasn't while preaching or teaching, but when I was talking with a recovering drug addict. He'd been in and out of treatment, and only recently come to church. I think that I'd given him too much advice, but he sighed, I'M TIRED OF TRYING. WHAT IF I AM AS GOOD AS I WILL EVER GET? Ever feel like the harder you try, the worse it gets? Paul tried hard but he was weary. What did him in was religion. It did not make him holy; it made him bitter. He did the right things but for the wrong reasons. He tried to be a good Jew, but he hated himself. It wore him out, left him empty, but empty was where God wanted him. Empty is where we all must be when we come honestly before God. Paul writes:

I am grateful to Jesus who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful, appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, a man of violence. What words strike you? I'd suggest the two little words: EVEN THOUGH. We are "even-though people", and that is how God uses us.

God uses me even though I'm not perfect. Even though I am broken. Even though I have a past. Even though I am arrogant, and overly proud

We got involved even though we didn't know what we were doing. We taught Sunday School even though we didn't know the Bible. We helped a friend in need even though we had needs; we forgave a person even though we needed to be forgiven. For Paul, even though wasn't a figure of speech but a **symbol of his life**. Even though he tried hard to practice faith, it was just making him rigid and judgmental. It took Paul half his life, trying so hard to please God that he made himself and others miserable. Spiritual growth isn't found in TRYING HARDER but TRUSTING MORE. Without the Spirit,


