In Odd Company

Let's face it: Christians are an odd group of people and I mean that as a compliment. What must it be like for someone outside Christianity to come

Our music is different. We pray a confession, admit mistakes publicly, someone says "our sins are forgiven" We pray as if we have a direct audience with God, who is actually listening and interested. We read an old book. Someone gives a talk to make sense out of it. We ask people to give hard-earned money to keep it all going! We sing a hymn and then we go home. I rest my case: we are odd people!

We expect Christians to be people of faith. What does it mean to have faith? The writer of Hebrews took a shot at defining it:

Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. The Greek word, "assurance" means reality. Faith isn't mere human optimism or wishful thinking: it is reality. Faith is like knowing where your house is. Faith is not, "I think I can, I think I can." You know faith. How do you know that your mother loves you? You just know. How do you know if you are happy or sad? You know. Faith is trust, knowing without seeing. Some think that "seeing is believing" but if we only believe what we can see, we live narrow and limited lives. If we could **see** it, it wouldn't be faith! Faith is a journey. The first step of faith always begins with a call to leave our **comfort zones**, the security of what we've known, and striking out into unknown, with only God to guide us. If we stay where we are, we'll miss it. The next time someone tries to dismiss your faith as mere wishful thinking, just smile and say...

No! Faith is reality. We all have faith in something/someone. I just chose to place faith in a God above/beyond, whom I can't control, whose ways are not my ways, yet who loves so much that he sent his son to earth to remind me how much I matter. Hanging around Christians is an odd thing to do. People who live by faith don't always see what other people see. Faith can put you at odds with other people. Folks have been persecuted because of their faith. Jesus once paused in the midst of what he was doing and asked...

Our church members recently had the opportunity to promote literacy in Guatemala by supporting the Libros Abiertos, or Open Books, program run by our retired mission co-workers, Debbie and Richard Welch. Debbie continues the project she started when they lived in Guatemala to give kids in the Coban region access to books. Public schools in the region receive very limited funding, and many schools and classrooms cannot afford books or a library for students. Open Books currently provides children's books for three schools with a request for a fourth, and an idea for a mobile library that could support multiple schools.


