A man walked into a ballroom, where a loud wedding reception was taking place. He noticed a woman sitting off to one side who appeared upset. He walked up to her, only to discover that it was the bride, who was watching all the festivities, and wondering if anyone would know that she was there. I wonder if Jesus feels ignored in our Christmas activities. He is the reason for the season, but you'd never know it by the way many of his people live. Isaiah predicted his coming, using titles like Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting father, Prince of Peace to describe him. It was originally a hymn written for King Hezekiah's coronation but notice how Isaiah prefaces his words...

PEOPLE WHO WALKED IN DARKNESS HAVE SEEN A GREAT LIGHT.

We know more about darkness than we do about light. We are living in stressful times. If ever a generation needed comfort, it is ours. Isaiah tells of a day when God's promise to David would come to pass: a stump from David's family tree who would be great. He wouldn't be just another King. He would be the Messiah, the Savior of the world. From the start, it was clear that Jesus didn't fit the narrow image of what they wanted in a Messiah. He didn't offer solutions to the world's problems or make any false promises that things would get better just because he was there. Jesus was a disappointment, not because he did not do anything, but because he didn't do what they expected. He still doesn't meet our expectations; he exceeds them. To all who received him long ago, to all who grasp WHO HE IS and WHY HE **CAME**, he gives us power to become God's children, born not of the flesh, but born of God. Millions of people, across the ages, have found him worthy of their trust. He is OUR FAITH, and not a PART OF FAITH. Jesus WAS and IS EVERYTHING.

In our darkest moments, we wonder if placing our trust in him is enough. When we see how some Christians live, how mean they act, how joyless and lifeless they seem, we wonder if faith is real. In every person's life, there is a "gotcha moment" when Jesus gets you, when he really gets you, and you are hooked. Christianity is like FALLING IN LOVE, saying yes or no with our lives to a PERSON, and not a multiple-choice test where we pick out certain beliefs. This year don't leave Christ out of your Christmas. His Christmas card to you might read... Let go the illusion that you are in control of life! Nothing in this world, except for God's faithfulness, is ever secure. All that you hold dear can be taken away. In the end, it will be okay. If it is not okay, it is not the end.
