During the summer, I will do a sermon series entitled "TO BE CONTIN-UED", based on Acts, Luke, its author, calls it "ACTS OF APOSTLES" but it might be called the ACTS OF HOLY SPIRIT. Acts was never meant to be the APOSTLES' GREATEST HITS. The main character wasn't John, Peter, or Paul but the HOLY SPIRIT. Luke picks up after Easter. The Disciples wait in an Upper Room, huddled in fear. The Holy Spirit comes in a mighty way and the Church was born. This wasn't Church as a place to come and go. This was Church as it was meant to be: a community, working together, serving together, caring for each other, carrying on Jesus' mission. This movement soon spread out in many directions, took in all people, and turned the world upside down. Luke will tell gripping stories of courage, love, and excitement. All the HEROES eventually die but the JESUS MOVE-**MENT** kept going.

Luke starts his story in Jerusalem and ends it in Rome. Luke left out the details of Paul's death. His purpose in Acts wasn't to glorify any one person but to glorify GOD. Instead of ending with Paul's death, he ends with Paul finishing his work. Paul ran his race, kept the faith, and he endured to the end. As far as Luke was concerned, what better way to end a story. His last words are the inspiration for this series...

writing what happened.



A New Season ~ God's Call

"To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die...A time to weep, and a time to laugh; A time to mourn, and a time to dance... A time to gain, and a time to lose; A time to keep silence, and a time to speak"... (Eccl:3)

The time has come for me to speak. At the time in 2006 when I sat with the pastor and Tammie Davis, and they extended God's call to become your Director of Music Ministry, I responded that I could envision spending the next fifteen years in your service. That was now eighteen years ago, and I have reached that magical full retirement age. After much prayer and counsel with Pastor Mike and the Administrative committee, I am certain God is calling us ALL into a new season.

Before my Susan passed away, she and I had long been prayerfully seeking the next chapter of our shared life. Even now after her departure, the sense of God's direction has become ever clearer. I have given all that I have to this position, and to this cherished family of faith and musicians. The fulfilment that I have received is far beyond all that I've invested. Now, it is equally clear to me that the needs of our music program going into the future are beyond my scope to fulfill. In the eleven months since Alice Sanders left, my weekly search for a permanent half-time organist has come up empty, leaving me the task of finding and preparing substitutes for 77 Sundays through the end of July. The challenge has been extraordinary!

There is a promising answer to this dilemma. In May, the Search Committee will post a national search for a single full-time position: **Organist/Choir Director** to begin on August 1st. This was once the exact profile this church enjoyed in its most abundant era. This move will also relieve the church's budget of a half-time salary, while bringing in a person with a fresh set of skills, visions and energy. Let us waken to the possibilities of how God is creating our future!

And for me, the call continues. I will continue to treasure my relationships here, while being free to travel to visit my three grown children and eight grandjoys. God has granted me professional opportunities as a guest performer, teacher, and conductor in their cities of San Francisco, Nashville, and Cleveland, OH. I am thankful beyond measure to the beautiful musicians and people of First Presbyterian who have made this a glorious chapter in Susan's and my life. As Ecclesiastes says, "God has made everything beautiful in its time. And He has put eternity in their hearts."

You will forever be in mine.
