

Getting Rid of the Middle Man

Many people find **ORGANIZED RELIGION** disappointing. It promises more than it delivers. How do we simplify Christianity and find the joy that first sparked **our interest in the faith?** My suggestion:

GET RID OF THE MIDDLEMAN. SEEK GOD FOR YOURSELF, DISCOVER HIS TRUTH, DISCERN HIS WAYS FIRST-HAND.

If I did my job well, I'd work myself **OUT OF A JOB** every few years. You have a **BIBLE**; you can study. You have a **HEART**; you can pray. You have a **MIND**; you can think. Speaking for all **MIDDLEMEN/WOMEN** out there, you must move **BEYOND US**. Don't grow dependent on us. No one can do your praying, your studying, or your serving for you. Nothing, not even a Cross, posed a greater risk to Jesus than preparing his Disciples for his leaving. They were dependent on him and unsure if they'd even survive without him. They resemble **CLOWNS** more than **HEROES**; they constantly trip over themselves. As his time ran out, Jesus withdrew from crowds, spent less time teaching in public and spent more time **TRAINING HIS DISCIPLES** in private. He mentored them. He wanted them to stand on their own two feet, and it's the same goal God has for us. Jesus knew **HOW VULNER-ABLE** they were but there are no spiritual short cuts. Imagine **their learning curve**:

How do you watch a man heal diseases, love unlovable people, without asking "Are we supposed to do that?" Or, hear him spin stories as if he were born to tell them, without asking, "Is that now my job?"

They learned how to read people/read scripture; how to handle success and failure; how to transition from being a follower to being a leader! We all have equal value in God's eyes, equal access in prayer, and equal responsibility for nurturing our faith. There is only **ONE TRUE RABBI**, Jesus once said, and only one worthy of our loyalty. In Christ, God cut the **middleman out of religion.** We are all precious to God, all equally important to God's good purposes for this world. Our spiritual **ROLE MODELS**, the **MIDDLEMEN/WOMEN** who shaped our lives, made their mark but there is **no substitute** for our own involvement. We grow only by direct encounter. We pray instead of just talking about prayer; we **read scripture** instead of waiting for someone to read it for us.

Are you ready? Your true teacher- the Holy Spirit - is ready. Start by vowing to learn something new from Jesus every day and allow him room in your lives to challenge/improve you.
