

Naked we came into the world, wearing our **BIRTHDAY SUITS** and we will leave the same way. What will we **LEAVE BEHIND?** When I die, I don't want any loving acts or sacrificial gifts to be lost. Many people leave nothing besides money behind because they miss their chances to make a difference. They die without having lived at all. We all have regrets. One of my mentors used to say, "DO THE BEST WITH WHAT YOU HAVE, WHERE YOU ARE, WHILE YOU CAN. I have strived to do my best, with what skills God has given, not only here but in the other churches that I served. I can't begin to count the blessings I've known. I am a "marked man" I bear the marks of all those who've touched my life. How can I say "thank you" for the words of encouragement, the acts of love and kindness that I've received from God's people for 40 years. I am who I am because many people helped me to get there. People prayed for me when I needed it; they loved me when I was down; they cared for me when I failed to meet all their needs. I'll soon stand in the pulpit for the last time. I will have the same lump in my throat I had many years ago. Rest assured of this: you have been a blessing to me and my wife, Donna, and we will never forget you. We will forever hold you in our prayers.

Clothes Closet Needs

The Clothes Closet will be changing from summer to fall/winter clothing shortly. We are in need of blankets/throws, jackets, coats, sweat shirts (hoodies), athletic shoes and socks, wool hats, gloves and toiletries. Thank you for your continued support.

Grab & Go Breakfast Ministry

The Grab & Go Breakfast Ministry is an outreach opportunity where members from First Presbyterian and our friends from First Broad Street United Methodist work together to help meet the nutritional needs of the homeless and hungry in our community. We provide bagged breakfast meals and water to our guests on Saturday and Sunday mornings from 7:00 AM -8:00 AM. The Methodist volunteers prepare sausage and biscuits so we are able to provide a hot food item in each bag. First Pres volunteers prepare the bags which include a fruit cup. crackers, a pastry or snack, the hot biscuit and a bottle of water; and then distribute the bags along with hot coffee to our quests. Travel size toiletries (shampoo, conditioner, soap/body wash, lotion, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, washcloths) and cold weather items (blankets, gloves, socks, toboggans, Hot Hands) are frequently requested items and we try to provide these when available. Volunteers are needed and there are several opportunities to help during the week and weekends. We will meet in the Fellowship Center immediately following the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, September 7th for a brief informational meeting about the Grab & Go Breakfast Ministry. A current project is adding Mike Shelton to our "wall of fame" - all our senior ministers.

Sixty-four years ago, Frances and Al Dryden were married at First Presbyterian; she found she had also married into a church congregation. She relates the Sunday they returned from their honeymoon- they entered the church and were greeted by a group of church leaders. "Al and Frances, you have been "chosen" to teach our 12th grade Sunday School class and serve as adult advisors for the youth group." They found it impossible to decline such an invitation and were attending a youth overnight retreat the next week! Years later they discovered other couples had also been greeted when they joined the church with similar "you have been chosen" greetings! Interesting recruitment method.

Frances crafts the "Prayer Squares" that are given to members experiencing a difficult time. She continues this project because members appreciate the token gift and thought from the congregation.

In 1995, right after Mission Possible II (major renovation adding the Fellowship Center, new entrance, and new church offices) Frances became a member of

the FF&E Committee (short for Fixtures, Furnishings, and Equipment). We had lots of new space to furnish. The Property Committee handles everything related to our Church building; the FF&E committee was charged with identifying and prioritizing the physical essentials for an efficient functioning church. Church school classes need a room but also chairs and other equipment to function. FF&E assessed what we had and what we needed; prioritized needs and developed a long-term plan to fulfill them. Occasionally unexpected needs like remediation of a leaking long-forgotten oil tank behind the church ate into budget plans. Gradually over the years Frances, who now chairs the group, and dedicated members work to meet the many needs of our church. Examples are the handicap ramp in the downstairs fellowship hall; repair of broken stain glass in the foyer; chairs for new Fellowship Center; signage for the inside and outside of the church; benches and large pots outside our main entry; furnishings for the History Room and many more projects than space allows. A 4-inch binder recently placed in the history room details them all. Their work is not always noticed; but, would be noticed if not handled – toilet seats, window blinds, cabinet doors that work, fresh paint, etc. As FF&E Chair she now serves on the Property Committee to coordinate the work of the two groups.

Frances says the philosophy for the work of FF&E has been "First Impressions Matter" Our church does not have to be fancy; but it needs to be warm, inviting, comfortable, neat, clean, and welcoming to encourage our members and visitors to stay. Thanks to a generous loving congregation most of our needs have been met with contributions of funds, connections to resources and personal time and energy painting, cleaning, etc. Many thanks to Frances and all the members who have worked diligently on FF&E over the past 30 years!
