## Betty Blass



## The History of Our Church

### History Repeats Itself

First Presbyterian Kingsport has brought potable water and purification to villages in Guatemala and Sneedville, Tennessee, and a school fountain in Guatemala. The Friends in Faith Class is carrying on the tradition with its gift this January.

In 1994 Barbara McCary's mother, a Peace Corps volunteer in Nepal, summoned son-in-law Pepper, an engineer, to Nepal to dig a well for the village where she was teaching. Pepper and the villagers hand dug a well!



In 2025, the Presbyterian Giving Catalog listed a drill for \$115 and a water pump for \$250. At its Epiphany party at the home of Allen and Becca Wright, the Friends in Faith class collected a "cover" charge, a donation for mission. The donations came close to the \$365 dollars for a drill and a pump.
